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ALL EYES ON NAPLES: THE BATTLE FOR THE J/22 **WORLD TITLE HEATS UP**

Get ready for a world-class showdown! As the 2025 J/22 World Championship in Naples draws nearer, excitement is steadily building around what promises to be a highly competitive and closely followed edition of the championship. Having highlighted the stunning location and prime sailing conditions in our spring newsletter, we now turn our attention to the growing list of confirmed participants and the compelling competitive narrative already taking shape in the lead-up to the event.

Scheduled from October 11 to 19 and hosted by Lega Navale Italiana Napoli at the historic Porticciolo del Molosiglio, the championship will bring together top-tier crews from around the world for up to twelve races in the iconic waters of the Bay of Naples. These same waters—set against the backdrop of Mount Vesuvius and Castel dell'Ovo-will also host the 38th America's Cup in 2027, underscoring Naples' rising prominence as a premier international sailing destination. The 2025 J/22 World Championship will thus serve not only as a top-level competition in its own right, but also as a preview of the world-class racing theatre Naples is poised to offer in the years to come.


Naples' selection as America's Cup host is no coincidence.

The city offers a potent combination of reliable Mediterranean wind regimes, technical sailing conditions shaped by coastal geography, and a deep maritime tradition. By staging the J/22 World Championship in this setting—just two years ahead of the Cup—the international class is positioning itself at the heart of sailing's global conversation.



Among the most anticipated entries is the return of the 2023 World Champions, the Dutch-flagged team FRAPORITA (NED 1273), skippered by Jean Michel Lautier with Giuseppe D'Aguino and Denis Neves. Their dominant performance at the Travemünder Woche, where they secured seven wins out of nine races, set a benchmark for excellence in the class. Their presence in Naples ensures that the title defence will be tested against an increasingly deep and competitive fleet.

Indeed, the growing list of registrants already includes several highly regarded Italian teams. Alcione (ITA 705), runner-up at the most recent Italian Sportboat Championship and winner of the 2024 J/22 Italian Nationals, enters the event as a top domestic contender. Close behind are Jolly Roger (ITA 606) and Pestifera (ITA 603), who claimed second and third place, respectively, at the national championship. Alongside them, boats such as Les Alizes, Margot, Lamù, and White Magic, all based in Naples, have been training intensively over the past months with the goal of reaching peak performance in time for the Worlds. Their familiarity with local conditions, honed through focused on-water sessions throughout the season, may provide a slight edge when racing begins in earnest.



The international profile of the regatta is also strengthening week by week. In addition to the reigning champions, several other foreign teams from the Netherlands and Germany have already registered or pre-registered. Notably, J-Bender (GER1449) took third place at the 2024 German Open in Travemunde, while *Jola* (GER 1411) achieved a third-place finish at the 2025 German Open. With further international entries anticipated, the fleet is shaping up to deliver a world-class level of competition, combining tactical excellence, local knowledge, and global experience.

Naples—with its blend of vibrant cultural heritage, deep maritime identity, and reliable mid-October sailing conditions—will offer the perfect backdrop for this event. As competitors finalize their preparations, it is increasingly clear that the 2025 J/22 World Championship will be more than just a regatta, it will be a celebration of the class' spirit and skill at the highest level, in a city rapidly emerging as one of the global capitals of competitive sailing.

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Technical Committee Report

In 2023, we celebrated the 40th anniversary of the first build of a J/22. During this time, the Class has grown and developed worldwide. During this 40 years, we continuously developed the Class Rules and made thoughtful and deliberate changes to them when necessary and always with an eye on fundamental fairness, controlling the cost of participation and maintaining a level playing field.

Not everyone is continuously monitoring the changes we have done during the time, and therefore I want to emphasize the mandatory personal and portable equipment. Some of the equipment which has been mandatory in earlier versions of the Class Rules are not anymore needed, e.g. water-resistant flashlight with spare batteries and bulb. On the other side, we have also excluded some optional equipment which has been allowed in earlier versions, e.g. spare spinnaker pole.

Here is the actual list of mandatory personal and portable equipment which is required:

- 1. One personal flotation devices (PFD) for each crew
- 2. One fixed device to deliver a magnetic compass heading or course over ground
- 3. One manual bilge pump
- 4. One anchor with 30m of non-floating line
- 5. One fog horn
- 6. One bucket with a minimum 9-litre capacity and attached lanyard
- 7. A marine first aid kit

- 8. Code Flag B (red protest flag)
- 9. A copy of the current Racing Rules
- 10. One paddle
- 11. A tow line at least 19 metres in length
- 12. Local or government mandated safety equipment

REMARK: The list has been simplified, and if in doubt, the text of the actual Class Rule prevails.

The list for the optional equipment is pretty lengthy and should include everything that might be needed on board for a race day. Everything that is not included in this list shouldn't be on board during a regatta.

I would like to encourage you to continue giving us feedback or comments. Only by that we can develop the Class in the spirit of its sailors. I am honored to work with all members of the various Committees of our Class to make our Class even better.

In December, there was no water (would we be able to hold this event?). In April, too much water (we could not hold the event as boats could not be launched safely). Rescheduled to June (these dates clashed with other events that crew had committed to, or boats needed to be moved to Cape Town for Lipton Cup). Despite this, 10 Gauteng based J/22s made it happen!

Great sailors, competitive teams, superb host club LDYC, competent Race Officer and committee boat crew all made for a great Nationals.

Our amazing sponsors **ULLMAN SAILS**, **ZIPTRAC, AMTEC and SAIL QUIP** honoured their commitment, which added a big "extra" for all the sailors. Our sincere thanks to you all, your ongoing support is appreciated.

With light winds on Saturday, and less predicted for Sunday, the Race Office had a prompt 12.00 start, took every advantage of the challenging conditions and completed four races. Light winds were not without interesting happenings on the water. Several 720s, twisted

spinnakers, unintentional protest flags flying and a general recall. Rumour has it the general recall was jinxed from a comment on the Bridge boat that *Majic* was "going to be over." She was, but all the others followed too closely!

Saturday's results indicated a close challenge between Caspar and DaJ for first, and eight boats with sights on third. With five boats 1 point apart, it was anyone's position. How wrong we all were. No racing Sunday, although the Bridge did try and was forced to abandon.

Monday winds looked promising with the Race Office planning one, ideally two races, to complete the event. The wind gods were kind. The Bridge made the most of the conditions, and three races were completed. This changed things dramatically.

The Ladies Trophy went to Jessica Roussouw for her ongoing commitment to the J/22 Class and regular participation in MOD and other events on the Vaal dam on *Jazzy*.

ULLMAN SAILS, with nine-year-old Max Giovannini as one of the crew, turned things around with their good results moving from eighth to overall third place and winning the Zero to Hero trophy.

Second Place *Casper***,** with solid results over seven races.

A well-deserved win for **DaJ**, our 2025 J/22 **National Champions**: Dirk Manten, Nic Kroucamp and JJ van Niekerk. Congratulations!!!

The positive posts and comments from the sailors confirm this J/22 Nationals was a success. We now look forward to watching those competing in Lipton Cup. Let's show them what the 1/22 fleet can do!






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Travemuende, July 19-21

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
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
