Marblehead, Massachusetts' Eastern Yacht Club will proudly host the 2025 J/70 Corinthian World Championship from September 22-27. This globally recognized event will showcase the skills and sportsmanship of many of the world's top Corinthian J/70 sailors in one of the most quintessential sailing towns on the east coast of the United States. Eastern Yacht Club (EYC) hosted the J/70 Worlds in 2018 and Corinthian US Nationals in 2021. Hank Stuart will return to join EYC's world class Race Committee team as PRO.

Racers are invited to arrive as early as Saturday, September 20 for local racing, clinics and other events to be announced. Registration will commence on the 22nd + haul out through Sunday the 28th. The event will feature one practice day followed by four Championship race days. The racing area will be the beautiful waters off of Marblehead, up to 3 nm from the EYC docks. Registration is open, and the link and NOR are at: https://easternyc.nautical-cloud.com/ notice-of-race. The preferred deadline with a discount is June 20th. Please book hotels or rental houses early, as September is a busy tourist month in the area. If you are traveling from afar and interested in sending your boat for the season, Eastern Yacht Club is offering a summer membership by application. Race the local Helly Hansen Sailing World Series in July, join in local fleet racing, and the Ted Hood regatta in August. Other boat storage arrangements will be available as well.

Anticipation is Growing in Sight of the First Ever J/70 Mixed Plus World Championship

Anticipation is growing for the first edition ever of the J/70 Mixed Plus World Championship, an absolute novelty introduced by the J/70 International Class which has entrusted its organization to the J/70 Italian Class, led by Federico Siragna.

Scheduled in Torbole between the 26th and the 29th of June, the event will be one for crews composed of four or more persons, containing no more than two males over 18 years of age: a choice that should make the event more inclusive, opening it up to the massive participation of younger sailors and female representatives.

Athis is a World Championship that promises to be colourful, dynamic and fun, undoubtedly open to every possible outcome, considering the fresh composition of the various crews. Registration has opened!

The location chosen for the event, northern Garda, is well known among pro sailors and enthusiasts by the name of Wind Factory. For those who don't know the weather at Garda, it regularly alternates between strong north winds (known as Peler), which blows in the morning until around 10.30, and a strong south breeze (the Ora), usually present from late morning until late afternoon.

Perfect conditions are expected, and a yacht club that needs no introduction ready to host the inaugural edition of the J/70 Mixed Plus World Championship. Many successful events have been organized over the years by the Circolo Vela Torbole, one of the most renowned sporting clubs on Lake Garda, currently chaired by Mauro Versini.

The club, which has private docks, has made available up to 60 places, and therefore it is important for those who intend to participate to complete the registration procedures as soon as possible to secure one of the available moorings and be able to

J/70 European Championship 2025 - KSSS

Just a few items to report. The NoR and SI templates were updated to reflect the new RRS, and we added the amendment wording for Vakaros RaceSense to Continental and World Championships. If you are the event organizer, you can reach out to the Class to get the template for use at your regatta.

The following Class Rules changes have been submitted to World Sailing for their approval. They are listed below. The biggest change has to do with the playing of the gennaker sheet. The old C.1.1(b) was deleted, and the Class now follows RRS 42. This will make it easier for the Class and sailors to follow.

C.1.1 RULES

(a) The ERS Part I – Use of Equipment shall apply.

(b) For the purpose of RRS 49 only, the cockpit safety line shall constitute a lifeline.

C.3.1 LIMITATIONS ON THE CREW

(a)The crew shall consist of 3 or more persons. The number of crew shall not be changed during an event.

(b)All members of the crew shall be current class members in good standing, except that a crew member other than the helmsperson is not required to be a class member if he or she holds a valid Group 1 Categorization in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 22. (c)No crew member shall be substituted during a world championship and any event of 6 or less consecutive days, without the approval of the event Technical Committee or in its absence the Race Committee.

(d)For events of two or more consecutive days, all crew shall be registered and shall be identified in any entry list, scratch sheet and results listing where the helmsperson, skipper or owner is identified.

C.3.2 LIMITATIONS ON THE HELMSPERSON

The helmperson shall be a current class member in good standing and meet the following criteria except in the event of an emergency involving the safety of the boat or crew where the boat may be steered by any crew member. Any such incident shall be reported to the event Technical Committee or in its absence the Race Committee, which may protest the boat. The penalty may be less than disqualification.

(a) Permitted helmsperson: The helmsperson shall hold a valid Group 1 Categorization in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 22 except that a Group 3 crew who owns and pays for 100% of a J/70 may helm.

(b) For events of six or less consecutive days, not more than two helmpersons can be designated. If two helmspersons are designated, **both shall be Group 1 and** at least one must be an owner. From five minutes before the start until the finish, the boat shall be helmed by the designated helmsperson(s) except for momentary absences for personal or shipboard needs not to exceed five (5) minutes when a Group 1 crew member may helm.

J/70 INTERNATIONAL TECHNICAL COMMITTEE REPORT

(c) The class executive committee shall be the sole interpreter of who qualifies as an owner.

I.4 CORINTHIAN DIVISION

Regatta organizers will present awards for a Corinthian division. To be considered as a Corinthian team, Class Rule C.3 is modified so the entire crew, including the owner/ helmsperson, shall provide proof of a valid World Sailing Group 1 categorization at the time of registration. The Corinthian division shall be scored as a sub-division of the whole fleet using the competitor's actual scores.

I.6 CORINTHIAN EVENT

Class Rule C.3 is modified so that all competitors, including the owner/helmsperson, shall provide proof of a valid World Sailing Group 1 categorization at the time of registration.

I.12 YOUNG CREW DIVISION

Regatta organizers will present awards for a Young Crew division. To be considered as a Young Crew team, Class Rule C.3 is modified so the entire crew, including the owner/ helmsperson, shall provide proof that no crew member is over 25 years of age. The Young Crew division shall be scored as a sub-division of the whole fleet using the competitor's actual scores.

I.13 YOUNG CREW EVENT

Class Rule C.3 is modified so the entire crew, including the owner/helmsperson, shall provide proof that no crew member is over 25 years of age.

I.11 MIXED-PLUS EVENT

Class Rule C.3 is modified so the **crew** shall consist of 4 or more persons and contain no more than two (2) males over 18 years of age.

I.14 OPEN

I.16 RACESENSE EVENT

Class Rule C.5.2 is modified to add Vakaros Atlas 2 (or subsequent Atlas versions) as required equipment for the purpose of starting and finishing with the Racesense system. Each boat shall either provide a working Atlas 2 at check-in for configuration with RaceSense, or an Atlas 2 will be provided by the Organizing Authority (OA) for a fee. Detailed requirements for the mounting and use of the device will be posted on the Official Notice Board and are incorporated by reference to this section.

LOOKING AHEAD

Members of the Technical Committee will be present at the Corinthian European Championship in Cascais Portugal, Mixed+ World Championship in Garda Italy, European Championship in Sandhamn Sweden, Corinthian World Championship in Marblehead, Massachusetts, North American Championship in Tampa, Florida, and the South American and World Championships in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

I am honored as I travel to work with the talented Measurers and members of the IJ70CA Technical Committee to make our Class even better. It is in great shape with all the work the Technical Committee has already put in to get us to this point. Barcelona Winter Series: An Exciting Start to the J/70 Season

The Barcelona Winter Series for J/70s is in full swing, and the excitement is building with each event! Organized by the Real Club Náutico de Barcelona (RCNB), this prestigious winter regatta series attracts top-tier sailors from around the world, bringing highperformance racing to the beautiful waters of the Mediterranean. Spanning five events from November to March, the series serves as a prime opportunity for teams to sharpen their skills before the Spring and Summer seasons kick off.

Each event follows a three-day format, from Friday to Sunday, with an optional training session on Thursday. The conditions have varied from light, tactical breezes to stronger, more dynamic winds, keeping both seasoned sailors and newcomers on their toes. With fierce international competition, the Barcelona Winter Series has quickly become a highlight of the European J/70 calendar.

Event 1: Tenaz Sets the Pace

The first event saw an impressive turnout, with 28 teams from 13 different nations eager to start their winter campaigns. The light winds proved challenging, limiting the number of races completed, but the action on the water was no less intense.

From the outset, *Tenaz*, skippered by Pablo Garriga with Rayco Tabares as tactician, demonstrated impressive consistency and control. They secured two key wins on Friday and continued their steady performance on

Saturday, which allowed them to maintain their lead. Sunday brought disappointment as the wind refused to fill in, leaving the standings unchanged. The local team *Hang Ten*, helmed by Món Cañellas, sailed well to finish second, while the Danish team *Lady in Red*, featuring former America's Cup sailor Sten Mhor, claimed the third podium spot.

Event 2: Olympic Talent Shines with Kimpton Hotels' Victory

The second event brought even tighter racing and a new face to the fleet—Olympic bronze medalist Joan Cardona at the helm of *Kimpton Hotels*, a new entry from RCN Palma.

After a slow start on Friday, where light winds allowed for only one race, the action ramped up on Saturday, with three races completed in better conditions. The German team *Diva* shined with solid results, putting them in the overall lead at the end of the day. Meanwhile, *Kimpton Hotels* and *Hang Ten* battled fiercely, staying neck-and-neck on points. HSN Sailing Team, improving their form, won the day's opening race and edged closer to the leaders.

Sunday proved to be the decider, with *Kimpton Hotels* delivering a clutch performance to secure the event victory by just one point over *Hang Ten* and *Diva*, who tied for second place.

Event 3: *HSN Sailing Team* Dominates in Perfect Conditions

The third event saw the best sailing conditions so far, with nine races completed over the weekend. The competition was fierce, with 25 boats from 12 nations pushing the limits.

After an intense battle, *HSN Sailing Team*, skippered by Javi Padrón, showed resilience and tactical brilliance, winning four races, including two crucial ones on the final day. Their strong performance propelled them to the top of the leaderboard, overtaking *Hang Ten-Hnos. Berga*, while *Noticia*, led by Luis Martín Cabiedes, made a strong push to finish third.

In the overall series standings, after three events and 15 races sailed, *Hang Ten-Hnos*. *Berga* holds onto first place, but *HSN Sailing Team* is gaining ground, while *Bodegas Can Marlés* remains in contention in third place.

Sailway Series J70: Action-Packed Racing in Vigo

The Sailway Series J70 kicked off in Vigo with two thrilling events, organized by the Real Club Náutico de Vigo and the J70 Class Association. These winter regattas have brought together top crews from Spain's Atlantic fleet, delivering high-level competition across both weekends.

Event 1: Araújo's Sets the Pace
